Summary

The meeting started at 09.00 am by welcoming remark and opening remark by Associate Professor Dr. Chanuantong Tanasugarn, Dean of Faculty of Public Health, Dr. Wiwat Rojanapithayakorn, AUN-HPN and MUGH Team Leader, and Associate Professor Dr. Nopraenue Sajjarax Dhirathiti, Vice President for International Relations and Corporate Communication.

The development and implementation of Health Literacy in Thailand was presented by the Deputy Director General of Department of Health, Dr. Amporn Benjaponpitak. The summary information was Thailand has been advocated health literacy (HL) into the national agenda and stated in the national strategic plan in the year 2016. The HL survey instruments has been developed and will be used for national survey in next year. Healthy University was presented by Dr. Wiwat Rojanapitayakorn. Under the AUN, the criteria for healthy university was proposed by using the baseline information from Mahidol University. Later on, Prof. Peter Change summarized the significant and global HL to health promotion. All three inputs were presented before the productive discussion.

After two half-day discussions, the meeting participants agreed upon:

- 1. All participated institutions will implemented Health Literate School/University.
- 2. All participated institutions will join AUN-MU-AHLA consortium to function health literacy in ASEAN and MU will be the focal point.

- 3. All participated institutions should have a standard topic/short course training in the future.
- 4. 7th AHLA conference in 2019 will be held in Thailand.
- 5. Areas of research to develop appropriate HL model for ASEAN and need a further discussion:

 Proposed by Dean Tanasugarn: each country may consider to focus on specific topic such as HL

 for Consumer protection (Myanmar), HL by using ICT (Indonesia), Health communication for HL

 (Malaysia), Media literacy (Taiwan), Healthy University (Thailand).
- 6. MUPH should develop International HL training course for ASEAN member.
