#### Dear APACPH Colleagues

The total amount of 2023 membership payments received as October 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023, is \$68.279.66 USD from 44 APACPH member institutions. It's great news that the number of active members has gradually returned to the pre-COVID period. Meanwhile, the current balance in Taipei account is \$434,344.89 USD. 

#### 1. New Leadership

- Director of Office of Public Health Studies (OPHS): There have been quite a few changes for this position in the recent years: Dr. Kathyrn Braun took the position after Dr. Jasom Moddack stepped down in 2014. Dr. Tetine Sentall became a selected director in Fall of 2019, and Dr. Alan Katz became the director in June of 2021. Dr. Eric Hurwitz has been the selected Director of OPHS since January 1, 2022. Dr. Hurwitz also serves as the Chair for both the MPH and PhD programs in Epidemiology. Dr. Hurwitz has the training and experience in occupational health focusing on injury prevention and control, and he knows the APACPH well and is interested in maintaining the current engagement and collaboration with APACPH.
- Dean of Thompson School of Social Work and Public Health Dr. Tetine Sentall acted as an interim Dean of the school when former dean Noreen Mokuau retired in the middle of 2020, and stepped down in August of 2023. Dr, Alex Ortega has been hired as the dean of our school since September 1, 2023 after an intensive search national wide. Dr. Ortega is a nationally recognized public health and health care policy scholar with a background in Epidemiology and Biostatistics. His research interest focuses on health equity and improving current understanding of the complex health risks and outcomes for immigrants and youth and families of Latino population. Dr. Ortega is also committed to work with APACPH and support the ongoing international collaboration and exchange programs.

#### 2. CEPH accreditation

The Office of Public Health Studies has just received a seven-year accreditation (September 6, 2023 through December 3, 2030) from the Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH) – an independent accreditation body recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. This accreditation is not just the results of excellent team effort in preparation of variety of reports, but also the indication of excellent performance of our educational programs.

#### 3. Master of Public Health Distance Education (MPH-DE)

The Office of Public Health Studies (OPHS) has recently launched an educational program offering the MPH degree (Distance Education option) specializing in health policy and management (HPM). This new education program (<a href="http://manoa.hawaii.edu/publichealth/degrees/graduate/master-of-public-health-distance-education">http://manoa.hawaii.edu/publichealth/degrees/graduate/master-of-public-health-distance-education</a>) is designed to provide individuals from the U.S. and the U.S.-Affiliated Pacific islands with a broad background for professional practice in the field of public health at state, national and international levels. Individuals from diverse professions and backgrounds will benefit from an MPH degree from UH Mānoa to take their careers to the next level. The MPH-DE can be completed in 21 months and classes are offered asynchronously. MPH-DE

students must meet the same MPH degree requirements as students enrolled in the campusbased degree pathway. Questions regarding the MPH-DE program should be directed to phonline@hawaii.edu.

#### 4. "3 + 2" Program in PH

This is a jointly accelerated educational program between the OPHS of University of Hawaii at Manoa (UHM) and SPH in China, which gives undergraduate students in public health and related fields the opportunity for early start in pursuing a master degree at UHM. The qualified students will study at their home university for 3 years to complete all required courses and then 2 year at UH for both undergraduate research and graduate study. The program will help participant students to get their BS from their home university in China and their master degree from UHM when they complete all the essential courses and practicum work in five years. This program is going to be active again after the COVID-19 pandemic interruption.

#### 5. International collaboration and Exchange (ICE)

The OPHS has maintained its collaboration and international exchanges with several universities in several nations despite of the pandemic:

- More than 30% of OPHS faculty members actively participated in ICE activities in last year and our ICE reached out to eight universities in the Americas (Canada and Brazil) and Asia (China and Malaysia) regions. Our ICE covered several areas of public health education including:
  - Lecturing/course teaching: for Environmental Health and Statistical Theory classes.
  - Research collaboration Maternal Health, Obesity, Adolescent Health, and environmental Health
  - More than ten Joint publications in peer-reviewed international journal in pH related fields.
  - o International conferences, and co-authored conference presentations.
- OPHS played a leading role in organizing/managing Active Aging Consortium in Asia Pacific (ACAP) with over 1000 members from more than 30 Asia-Pacific countries.
- Dr. Krishnan Rajam visited OPHS at university of Hawaii in August and expressed his interest in working with the OPHS for enhance global health education In future. Dr. Rajam was a professor of University Malaya and well-recognized public health scholar in Injury and Violence prevention. Dr. Rajam was a former WHO Technical Officer in Manila regional office and also a APACPH coordinator for injury prevention in the late 1990.
- Hawaii Regional Office has also been working with several collaboration schools of public health in China for two goals: 1) to establish new 3+2 educational program and 2) to encourage and assist them to become a new member of APACPH. Xiangnan Medical College is currently applying for the new membership.

#### 6. APHA's 2023 Annual Meeting and Expo

This year's Annual meeting of the American Public Health Association will be in Atlanta, Georgia between November 12-15. **The meeting** is the premier public health event of the year

offering innovative and exciting opportunities to **help** public health professionals reach their personal and professional goals. **Engage** with public health experts, **collaborate** with other advocates, and **grow** professionally. Quite a few faculty members and students of the OPHS are going to attend the meeting as in the past years.




Figure 3 Welcoming party by Yongsei Hospitals and HIRA to APACPH KI delegates, Seoul

#### 3.0 Peer Review

#### 3.1 Average Time to First Decision

The average time to First Decision and Final Decision increased to 71 days (from 54 days) and 75 days (from 61 days) in 2022.



**Time to First Decision** is defined as all original submissions that received their first decision within each year, regardless of when the manuscripts were submitted. Revisions are not included. SAGE recommended duration: **30-35 days**.







Alternative metrics are becoming increasingly visible in scholarly publishing. Altmetric tracks online mentions of journal articles across online platforms and uses an algorithm to score accordingly. The score is a helpful measure of online engagement and visibility, but it is not directly linked to citations or usage.

### 8.0 Cite Score

Scopus provides the journal's CiteScore, which is calculated as the total citations made in the CiteScore year and the prior three years to content published in the CiteScore year and the prior three years, divided by the total number of items published by the journal in the CiteScore year and prior three years.


